To create groups among the students, this will focus on self motivation of students towards studying the subjects then and there and enhance their learning speed

3. Context:

It is found that the students are not having the habit of studying regularly and it is observed that the pace of understanding of complicated concepts and theories differs with respect to students. Several students are facing difficulty in applying concepts they have studied in solving problems. It becomes necessary to implement a methodology to address the above issues and hence the peer group methodology is implemented.

4. Practice:

The peer group method is having following activities which have been practiced.

1. Students in a class are grouped in to various peer groups among themselves considering the following criteria - their ability to observe fastly, marks, performance during class delivery , friendship circle etc.,
2. In every group students with fast learning, slow learning, good performance, average performance will be members.
3. Each group is member is given the task of ensuring proper learning of fellow members. The good performers are asked to coach the slow learners in the subject they need support, so that the slow learners also perform well in the subjects.
4. Assignments / problems are given group wise and each group is asked to develop solution by discussing among themselves.

5. Evidence of Success:

In the odd semester 2016-17, the peer group helped us in increasing the results. The effort required to moul the students is also get reduced considerably as the group internal motivation among the students.

6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required:

Problems Encountered:

1. It is felt difficult to make the students and faculty members to understand the usefulness of peer group.
2. Initial hitches in implementing and regular monitoring were there.
3. Documentation of the peer group activities were found difficult.
